ART CLUB – DONNA ROTHGEB

Midyear is a good time to reflect on where a group has been and where it is going. This article will concentrate on what we have done thus far in 2018. Next month, we will discuss plans for the remainder of the year. Our goal is to have at least 11 workshops in 2018.

IHMAC Artists have had one or more workshops every month except in April thus far. Steve Greenwall, our talented artist and retired teacher from Iola, just completed a four-day workshop, instructing the group how to gesso paper for a surface to draw on with pastels. This time Greenwall used water to create a watercolor-like underpainting before continuing with just pastels. Greenwall has also held one other pastel three-day workshop this year as well as an Open Studio lesson each month on the third Monday—except April. Because of the construction for the elevator, the Inge festival activities, and the Tea Party, we decided to not try anything in April. The Open Studio allows the IHMAC Artists to bring their own choice of subject matter and medium. Greenwall circulates around the class, helping each artist individually with whatever his/her needs are.

A new instructor for us this year is Rick Bushnell, a retired high school teacher from Chanute, KS. His focus this time has been on pastels as well. Rick shared with us two different pastel classes; the second one was coupled with the use of watercolor with the pastel. Rick's classes were also popular; I'm sure the group will ask him to return!

In May, the IHMAC Artists prepared a salad luncheon for the museum members on the second Friday of the month. Last week the IHMAC Artists were responsible for the Verdigris Valley Art Exhibit reception/critique and on July 6 the group will hold another reception for Steve Greenwall's demonstration which is part of both VVAE and ASTRA. You are encouraged to attend. All IHMAC members get in free. Visitors pay on \$5 for an adult museum admittance and \$3 for children. Military with ID get in free. Greenwall will be demonstrating how to create a gesso surface for pastels and how to do an underpainting and finish off the art piece with pastels. A free print by Greenwall will be taken home by some lucky attendee at this event! July 16 is Greenwall's regular Open Studio Monday.
